Why use land that is less productive?

Farmers can't produce food crops like corn and soybeans on low productivity land. Fiber crops are ideal for this land as they perform well in low productivity soils and provide the farmer with an economic return from the normally idle land. By choosing to produce on this land, eathable does not compete with food crops.
